Visions of a Re/humanized Mathematics for LGBTQ+ Students PD Series

Are you wondering how to make your mathematics classes more LGBTQ+ inclusive or why/how LGBTQ+ identity matters in mathematics? This professional development opportunity has been designed for you!

The Queer Mathematics Teacher is offering a 6-part (virtual) professional development series for teachers of mathematics in grades 6 - 12 or for teacher educators working with in-service or pre-service teachers in grades 6-12.

The series will provide teachers with an opportunity to explore ideas related to LGBTQ+ identity, heteronormativity in K-12 schools, queer theory, queer pedagogy (e.g., mathematical inqu[ee]ry), and centering queer joy in their mathematics instruction.

Teachers will also be provided with examples LGBTQ+ inclusive mathematics tasks that have been designed for middle and high school students. Some of these tasks were developed and/or implemented during the Camp of Mathematical Queeries, while others have been designed and/or implemented to be used in middle or high school classrooms.

At the end of the 6-part series, teachers will also be provided with an opportunity to begin developing their own mathematics task and receive feedback on that task.
