TODOS STATEMENTS AND PUBLICATIONS

Where is Manuel?

This vignette was inspired by stories shared about young people during virtual learning. Its purpose is to reject claims of “learning loss” and present a perspective that illuminates the opportunities students may have had for authentic learning outside of the schoolhouse. The vignette attempts to shift the deficit focus from what students “lost” and how to “fix” them to focus on the joy of mathematics.

Positioning Multilingual Students for Success in Mathematics

This new joint statement with NCSM prioritizes policies and practices that position multilingual learners (i.e., children learning mathematics in languages that differ from their students’ first languages) so that they can access, engage, and thrive in mathematics education.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Prioritizing Antiracist Mathematics Webinar

This webinar was a virtual space for reflection and planning around the TODOS Position paper, *The Mo(ve)ment to Prioritize Antiracist Mathematics*, and the four commentaries. Attendees had the opportunity to make connections and find space and time for some healing and networking. The webinar also provided opportunities for attendees to plan actions steps that would create a movement for themselves and those they serve.

TODOS Virtual Leadership Institute

The inaugural leadership institute began on Zoom in June of 2021, following the TODOS conference. Julia Aguirre, Gloria Brown Brooks, Heather Navarro, Zandra de Araujo, and Maria Zavala co-facilitated the 7 hours, split over two days. The leadership institute was largely successful, and we will continue to offer it in even-number years. It is possible that this could become a signature offering of TODOS, with planning, attention, and budget.

TODOS Podcast

The TODOS Podcast is in its 3rd season. An emphasis has been to highlight emerging important topics and the contributions of scholars of color. This season Jon Oaks was featured to discuss the TODOS Statement in Support of LGBTQ+ Persons. The podcast is hosted by Maria Zavala.

TODOS Live! and TODOS/CASIO Education Webinars

TODOS Live! continues to offer invigorating professional learning to the mathematics education community. Topics ranged from explicit connections to the TODOS 2020 Position Paper, *The Mo(ve)ment to Prioritize Antiracist Mathematics*, to topics of diversity and inclusion, and community mathematics events. In addition, Data Science Literacy was the topic of the joint webinar hosted by TODOS and CASIO Education.

PARTNERSHIPS

Heising-Simons Award

TODOS received a two-year award of \$100,000 total from Heising-Simons in June 2021 to develop and strengthen its infrastructure to escalate its efforts to advocate for equity. H-S also funded a consultant to work with TODOS on organizational assessment and development. Efforts have begun in the following areas: moving *TEEM* to OJS, determining a publishing software license for TODOS, organizing TODOS recordings in Vimeo, updating and streamlining the website, discussing fund development ideas, creating a TODOS Conference Handbook as a guide for TODOS Conferences, and creating a Professional Development Handbook as a guide to provide PD for schools, districts, and other entities. The consultant, La Piana Consulting, is working with TODOS to address the following big question: Should our primary purpose be to provide resources to members or to change systems?

TODvXS= is TODOS's newest Special Interest Group (SIG). The mission of TODvXS=, which follows the mission of TODOS, is to advocate for equity and high-quality mathematics education for all students, in particular 2SLGBTQIA+ (Two-Spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer/Questioning, Intersex, Asexual/Agender, and other non-normative gender identities and sexualities) students. Two Town Halls were organized: the most recent provided ideas on the Intersectionality of 2SLGBTQ+ people and Mathematical + Identities. Future activities include inviting presenters to provide a TODOS webinar, podcasts, and blogs to create supportive mathematics classrooms for 2SLGBTQIA+ students.
